Records Established:

Most overtime wins:

Edina won its tenth overtime game, the most by any other team (they were tied with Duluth East at nine wins).

Most saves by goalie in tournament:

Lakeville South goalie Henry Welsch had 131 saves in his three tournament games. This surpassed the record that had been held by St. Paul Johnson's Doug Long (124) in 1970.

Most converted penalty shots by team in game:

Blaine converted two penalty shots in its game with St. Thomas Academy. No team had ever made two in a game.

Records Tied:

Fewest penalties assessed to both teams in one game:

Delano and Greenway/Nashwauk-Keewatin did not commit a penalty in their first round game. There have now been 11 penalty-free games in tournament history.

Converted penalty shots by individual:

Blaine's Cam Shoberg and Cole Hansen both took advantage of their penalty shots in their game with St. Thomas Academy. There have now been ten penalty shots converted in tournament history.

Jottings:

The Edina boys and girls hockey teams won state championships this year. The only other time that has happened was in 2005 when the Academy of Holy Angels won the boy's AA title and the girl's won the Class A crown.

Mahtomedi lost to Greenway in overtime, keeping the Zephyrs winless in all of their tournament overtime games (they are 0-7). Those seven losses are second only to Hill-Murray (7-10 in overtime contests).

White Bear Lake continues to struggle to post an opening round win in the tournament. They are 0-19 in quarterfinal games.

New Ulm is looking for its first win in any round. The Eagles are 0-12 in six past tournaments.
