Minnesota State Girls' Hockey Tournament Records that were established or tied in 2021

Records Established:

Most shots on goal by team in period:

Warroad had 34 shots on goal in the second period of their game with Rochester Lourdes. The record had been 29 by Mound Westonka/W-M/SW Christian against Mankato East/Loyola in 2019.

Most shots on goal by both teams in period:

Warroad and Rochester Lourdes combined for 35 shots on goal (34 by Warroad) in the second period of their game. The record had been 34 by Mound Westonka (29) and Mankato East/Loyola (5) in 2019.

Most saves by goalie in period:

Rochester Lourdes' Ida Huber recorded 30 saves in the second period of her game with Warroad. In 2019, Andrea Schreiber from Mankato East/Loyola had made a record 27 saves in the second period of her game with Mound Westonka.

Most short handed goals by player in game:

Proctor/Hermantown's Alyssa Watkins had three short handed goals in her game with Luverne. The record of two was jointly held by Krissy Wendell of Park Center (against Chaska, 2000) and Amanda Trunzo of Benilde-St. Margaret's (in a 2007 game against North Metro Stars).

Most short handed goals by player in period:

Alyssa Watkins of Proctor/Hermantown, in her game against Luverne, had three short handed goals in the second period. The record previously was held by Benilde-St. Margaret's Amanda Trunzo when she scored two in the second period against the North Metro Stars in 2007.

Records Tied:

Most short handed goals by team in game:

Proctor/Hermantown had three short handed goals in their game with Luverne, tying the record held by two other schools, most recently by Chisago Lakes (against Hutchinson) in 2010. **Most short handed goals by both teams in game:**

Proctor/Hermantown and Luverne combined for three short handed goals (all by Proctor/Hermantown), tying the record previously achieved in three other games. The most recent was Chisago Lakes and Hutchinson in 2010.

Fewest penalties by both teams in game:

There were no penalties assessed in the Eastview vs. Stillwater game. There had been two other games in tournament history without a penalty (most recently by Minnetonka and Andover in 2019).

Jottings:

Alexandria played in their 14th girls' state tournament, one shy of South St. Paul's record 15.

When Edina and Andover faced off for the Class AA Championship, it was the first time two undefeated teams had played for the title.

Minnetonka coach Tracy Cassano is only the second coach to have mentored three different schools (Rosemount, Burnsville and Minnetonka) to the girls' state tournament. The other coach was Jack Gravel (Benilde-St. Margaret's, North Metro Stars and Mound Westonka).

Alexandria's tying goal against Minnetonka with only fourteen seconds remaining in the game was the second latest goal to tie a game. The record is ten seconds when Bloomington Jefferson did it against South St. Paul in 1999. Jefferson went on to win that game in the second overtime.

Of the 32 officials that worked the tournament this year, 16 of them were first timers to the state tournament.

Coach David Marvin of Warroad has now coached 11 teams in the state tournament and, with his win over Rochester Lourdes, recorded 23 wins, second only to South St. Paul's Dave Palmquist's 15 appearances and 27 wins.

Alexandria's loss to Minnetonka in overtime in the first round of Class AA play was the seventh time the Cardinals played in a state tournament overtime game. No other team has played in more than five. They lost their fifth overtime game, also a record.

Edina coach Sami Reber now has four state championships, tied for the most with Shawn Reid from Blake and South St. Paul's Dave Palmquist.

Proctor/Hermantown and Gentry Academy's double overtime championship game was the ninth time a title game needed extra playing time. Of those nine, three went two overtimes. Only the 2012 Breck vs. South St. Paul game had more elapsed time (61:55) than the P/H and Gentry game (56:03).
