Minnesota State Girls' Hockey Tournament Records that were established or tied in 2022

Record Established:

Least time between three goals by individual in game:

Warroad's Lila Lanctot shattered the record for the least amount of time in scoring three goals. In her game against South St. Paul, she scored three in a span of 1:38, breaking the 2:18 record that was achieved twice by Eagan's Natalie Darwitz in 1997 and 1998.

Records Tied:

Fewest shots on goal by team in period:

Burnsville failed to get a shot on goal against Minnetonka in the first period, tying 14 other teams. The most recent was Luverne in 2020.

Fewest saves by goalie in period:

Sophia Johnson from Minnetonka did not have a save in the first period of her game with Burnsville, tying 20 other goalies that went an entire period without a save. The most recent was Breck's Sarah Peterson in 2020.

Most penalties by team in period:

Mankato East was assessed five penalties in the second period of their game with River Lakes, tying the record held by eleven other schools, most recently by Farmington in 2019.

Most penalties by both teams in period:

Mankato East and River Lakes were whistled for eight penalties in the second period of their game. This tied the record held by three other schools, last achieved by Farmington and White Bear Lake in 2019.

Jottings:

There were a record three penalty-shots attempted in this year's tournament. Kianna Roeske from River Lakes became only the second player to convert one when she scored in her game against Luverne. The only other player to score on a penalty-shot is Sadie Lindsey from Breck (in 2019).

Andover is only the eighth team to complete a season without a loss. The Huskies finished 30-0.

For the first time since 2001 there were no overtime games played in the entire tournament.

When Andover scored just 15 seconds in to the championship game against Minnetonka, they broke the title game record of 21 seconds that had been achieved twice; by Minnetonka against Hill-Murray in 2015 and by Blake against Thief River Falls, coincidentally in that same year. The all-time record for earliest goal scored to begin a game is :07 by Stillwater against Moorhead in 2006.

South St. Paul played in their record sixteenth state tournament.

Minnetonka coach Tracy Cassano is only the second coach to have mentored three different schools (Rosemount, Burnsville and Minnetonka) to the girls' state tournament. The other coach was Jack Gravel (Benilde-St. Margaret's, North Metro Stars and Mound Westonka).

Of the 32 officials that worked the tournament this year, nine of them were first timers to the state tournament.

Coach David Marvin of Warroad has now coached 12 teams in the state tournament and recorded 26 wins, second only to South St. Paul's Dave Palmquist's 16 appearances and 28 wins.

Veteran official Tai Thorsheim worked his eighth tournament, tying two others for the most in tournament history. His 23 tournament games and six state championship games are both records.
