# Minnesota State Girls' Hockey Tournament Records that were established or tied in 2023

#### **Records Established:**

#### Most goals scored by team in game:

Warroad scored 15 goals in their game against Albert Lea, breaking the record of 13 (also by Warroad in 2012).

#### Most goals scored by both teams in game:

Warroad and Albert Lea combined to score 16 goals in their game, breaking the record of 14 (by Warroad and Detroit Lakes in 2012).

# Most power play goals scored by both teams in game:

Moorhead (4) and Centennial/Spring Lake Park (2) combined to score six power play goals, breaking the record of five (most recently by Breck and Red Wing in 2012).

# Longest amount of time without either teams scoring to start game:

It took 69:10 of playing time before South St. Paul scored in its 1-0 win over Fergus Falls.

# **Records Tied:**

## Most penalties by team in game:

Centennial/Spring Lake Park were whistled for ten penalties in their game against Moorhead, tying the record held by three other teams (the most recent by Eagan in 2009).

#### Most power play goals scored by team in game:

Moorhead (against Centennial/Spring Lake Park) scored four power play goals, tying the record that had been held by Breck in 2012.

#### Most power play goals scored by team in period:

Moorhead scored three power play goals in the third period of their game with Centennial/Spring Lake Park. The record now is held by four other teams, most recently by Warroad in 2020.

#### Most power play goals scored by both teams in period:

Moorhead and Centennial/Spring Lake Park combined to score four power play goals (three by Moorhead) in the third period of their game. This tied the record held by Stillwater and Roseville Area in 1997.

# Most power play chances by team in game:

Moorhead had nine power play opportunities in their game with Centennial/Spring Lake Park. This tied the record held by four other teams, the most recent was St. Paul United in 2016. **Most short-handed goals scored by team in game:** 

Gentry Academy had three short-handed goals in their game against Moorhead, tying the record held by three other teams (the last team to accomplish this was Proctor/Hermantown in 2021.

#### Most short-handed goals scored by both teams in game:

Gentry Academy and Moorhead combined to score three short-handed goals in their game, tying the record held by four others teams (the last time this happened was when Proctor/Hermantown and Luverne scored three combined).

## Most short-handed goals scored by team in tournament:

Moorhead scored four short-handed goals this past tournament. This tied the record that was held solely by Park Center in 2000.

# **Jottings:**

Warroad's Talya Hendrickson was credited with eight assists in the tournament. This tied the mark held by Breck's Emily Zumwinkle in 2020.

There was one penalty-shot awarded in the tournament (by Sophie Strammel of Rosemount in her game against Moorhead). She did not convert the attempt.

There were five overtime games played in the entire tournament (curiously there were none last year). South St. Paul and Proctor/Hermantown played in two of them, tying the record for most overtime games played in a tournament. South St. Paul also played in their record-tying seventh overtime game (Alexandria also has played seven) and by winning their fourth o.t. contest, tied Hibbing/Chisholm and Andover for most o.t. wins.

South St. Paul played in their record seventeenth state tournament.

Minnetonka coach Tracy Cassano is only the second coach to have mentored three different schools (Rosemount, Burnsville and Minnetonka) to the girls' state tournament. The other coach was Jack Gravel (Benilde-St. Margaret's, North Metro Stars and Mound Westonka).

Coach David Marvin of Warroad has now coached 13 teams in the state tournament and recorded 29 wins, second only to South St. Paul's Dave Palmquist's 17 appearances and 30 wins. Coach Marvin also, with Warroad's championship win, joins an elite group of three other coaches that have won four State Championships.

Of the 32 officials that worked the tournament this year, eleven of them were first timers to the state tournament.

Veteran officials Tai Thorsheim and Brian Perpich worked their record ninth tournaments. Tai also has worked the most games (26) and most State Championship games (7).
